# **Acronym awards**

Kathy Pienaar and Khalid Shamis were awarded the SAGE acronym in 2014. They officially received their acronym certificates on 26 March 2015, in Johannesburg and Cape Town respectively. Both evenings, which were a chance for editors and other industry professionals to meet and network, were a huge success. A big thank you to NHU Africa, which sponsored wine at the Cape Town event.









Our acronym indicates peer recognition of excellence in a field. It is the highest honour that SAGE can bestow on an editor. The acronym application process aligns itself with the international standards set by the American Cinema Editors (A.C.E.) and Australian Screen Editors (A.S.E.) associations, making it a rigorous process for both the applicant and committee.

We've also arranged with the <u>Internet Movie Database</u> to add our acronym to their list of Guilds, Union and Associations. Acronym holders who have an IMDB profile and who would like to add the acronym can send a request to us.

# Workshops: past and future

In January we had our first event in Johannesburg, namely Managing Multiprojection, presented by Catherine Meyburgh S.A.G.E. and Zana Marovic at the Johannesburg Art Gallery (JAG). They discussed their collaboration in creating artist William Kentridge's Refusal of Time exhibition, with music by composed by Philip Miller. Refusal of Time is a multi-projection art installation commissioned for dOCUMENTA (13) in Kassel. The <a href="exhibition">exhibition</a> is now at the Iziko South African National Art Gallery in Cape Town and SAGE will host a similar event on Sunday, 19 April. More details will follow soon.

We're also in the process of planning an Assistant Editors workshop, which will take place in the next few months.

## Survey
