Rough Cut Lab

In 2017 SAGE launched the first Rough Cut Lab in collaboration with Encounters and The Refinery, and the next one will happen this year in May. The RCL targets films and filmmakers in post-production when access to internationally recognised industry expertise with local insight and advice can prove instrumental in shaping the success of documentary films as they enter the marketplace. These filmmakers will be allocated an experienced editor to offer insight and assist in workshopping the challenges highlighted in the documentary projects.

Submissions will close on Friday, 19 April. The mentors will be Megan Gill, Ronelle Loots and Khalid Shamis, all SAGE acronym holders with international acclaim. We also plan to hold a discussion session during the Encounters film festival in June.
